The edited volume *Claiming the People's Past: Populist Politics of History in the Twenty-First Century* offers the first global and systematic overview of populist politics of history in the twenty-first century. This digital MSA session combines the launch of *Claiming the People's Past* with a critical discussion by two experts on the volume's contribution to the growing body of literature exploring the intrinsic relationship between memory and populism. Bringing insights from a variety of contexts together, the session discusses what the 'populist moment' means for new developments within the dynamic field of memory studies.
