The International Network for the Theory of History (INTH) was founded in 2012 in Ghent and has since grown into a vibrant community of over 1,500 scholars. Through the network, we facilitate the exchange of ideas and collaboration, by <u>offering a directory of theorists of history</u>, an online community-based <u>bibliography</u> of theory of history, as well as a forum for announcing events.

As we prepare for the next Biannual Network Conference in 2026, to be held in Tallinn, we are forming a working group to reflect on the future direction of INTH. Our goal is to explore new services and resources we could offer to theorists of history worldwide, as well as to consider the legal structure of the network.

After reviewing the responses, we are eager to advance this initiative and reflect on the future of our network. To take the next steps, we propose holding the **first meeting of this working group on March 21st at 14:00 (GMT +1).**
